
- openSUSE Ambassador the last 2 years

5 Reasons to attend GSOC

- One of several ways to develop software for openSUSE Project
- Your are being mentored by an experienced member of the openSUSE community
- You develop software which is gonna be used by the whole openSUSE community
- Community is with you: Feedback, help, interaction and ideas!
- Apart from earning money , you gain experience!

5 points of "What does a GSOC failure mean?

- You didn't work, you just got in and did nothing else
- You began but after a couple a weeks you gave up
- Lack of any previous experience with the subject
- Miscommunication between the student and the mentor
- You made a big effort but it wasn't enough to pass the evaluation

5 points of "What does not a GSOC failure mean"?

- This is the end of the world
- You won't have a chance to participate next time
- You won't be a member of openSUSE Community
- You have been an idle developer
- Your failure was mentor's wish

5 Tips & Tricks

- Don't under or overestimate your skills
- First talk with the mentor and then submit your proposal
- Focus more on the experience rather than the amount of money
- Make a flexible time schedule for the entire GSOC period. Always have a Plan B, in case of a failure
- Before suggesting your idea find a project you would like to contribute to. That makes your idea more beneficial

- Carry on with the development of openSUSE Connect plugin
- By November I begin my Master Thesis with title: "Dive into openSUSE Project and its aspects.Plugin development for openSUSE Connect"
- Participate to GSOC 2013 with openSUSE Project
- Be an active Ambassador
